As Chair of the Tenth DST Group* HUMS Conference (HUMS2017), I personally invite you to consider the attached sponsorship proposals.

HUMS2017 will be conducted in Melbourne during 26 Feb – 2 Mar 2017 in association with 17th Australian International Aerospace Congress AIAC17 (aiac17.com) and the Australian International Airshow at Avalon. The formal papers will be on the first two days with visits to the Airshow on the Wednesday and Thursday. A preliminary timetable and list of papers will be available soon on the website www.HUMSConference.com.au.

Despite the initial conference in this series concentrating on monitoring systems for helicopters, the DST Group* HUMS Conference series has widened in scope to cover, not surprising in light of our connection with the Australian International Airshow, all aircraft, but also other platforms including land vehicles and maritime platforms, and other aspects such as data management and logistics aspects. Samples of previous conference papers can be found on the Papers page of the HUMS website. Previous attendees have included regulators, operators (including civil and defence from Europe, USA, UK, Australia and New Zealand), suppliers (including all major HUMS manufacturers), aircraft/helicopter manufacturers (from Europe, UK, USA, South Africa, etc.), consultants and academia (including Universities in USA, UK, Europe and Australia).

Specific topics include:

- Condition monitoring and health management
- Life and Usage management
- Condition Based Maintenance (CBM)
- Diagnostics and prognostics
- Rotor track and balance
- Vibration and acoustic analysis
- Wear debris analysis
- Structural loads & health monitoring
- Cost-benefit models
- Data management schemes
- Sustainment asset management
- HUMS certification, qualification or validation & verification

For professional conferences, sponsorship is a win-win-win factor. Sponsorship delivers a benefit to the sponsors, a reduced registration fee to those attending and allows the organisers to efficiently manage the financial aspects of the conference.
